Log Book. There is a 'Log Book' in the Church on the table near the side door. If you enter the Church building for any reason please fill in your details as in name and date of visit before you leave as we have been told we need to keep such records by the Diocese.

<u>Sunday Service Booking System</u>. If you wish to book your seat to attend Church in the actual building on Sundays then please contact the Church Office via email or telephone by Wednesday at 1pm of the week you wish to attend.

<u>Live Stream/Audio Help Required</u>. For all those interested in operating live stream and/or audio in Sunday services going forward who were unable to make the recent training session please contact Keith asap.

Sunday Service Etiquette. Only turn up to Sunday services in the building itself if you have booked a seat in advance. Chairs will be labelled with family/individual names as needed and are likely to change each week so do not assume you will be sitting in the same place each visit. Entry will be through the side entrance to the church and exit through the main door of the Church (unless disabled access is required) and will be strictly controlled for the sake of social distancing. Be aware that you will mandatorily be required to hand sanitise on entry and exit of the building (hand sanitiser will be provided). You will find an 'Order of Service' on your seat which should be taken home with you following the service. Please bring a Bible with you if you wish as we cannot make those in Church available for use at the moment. However, the Bible passage will be printed with the 'Order of Service'. Toilet facilities will be open if needed but everyone should use the disabled loo with handles, etc cleaned immediately following that use. Face coverings are encouraged for all those attending the service in the building.
