

NOTICES

Log Book. There is a 'Log Book' in the Church on the table near the side door. If you enter the Church building for any reason please fill in your details as in name and date of visit before you leave as we have been told we need to keep such records by the Diocese.

NHS Test & Trace App. We advise all those who can to download this to their smartphone and use it **every time** they enter either the Church or the Church Centre. Please note that for those who don't have a smartphone, alternative contact tracing methods such as pen-and-paper logbooks will be in place in both venues.

Sunday Service Booking System & Service Etiquette. If you wish to book your seat to attend Church in the actual building on Sundays then please contact the Church Office via email or telephone by Wednesday at 1pm of the week you wish to attend. **Please be reminded that we are now using the telephone landline for all queries, 01245-284663!** Chairs will be labelled with family/individual names as needed. Please sit on the labelled seat(s) and not those next to it/them. Entry is through the side entrance to the church and exit through the main door of the Church (unless disabled access is required) and will be strictly controlled for the sake of social distancing. Hand sanitising on entry/exit is mandatory (hand sanitiser will be provided). You will find an 'Order of Service' on your seat which should be taken home with you following the service. Toilet facilities will be open if needed but everyone should use the disabled loo with handles, etc cleaned immediately following that use. **Face coverings are MANDATORY for all those attending the service in the building.**

APCM Plus PCC & Deanery Synod Vacancies. The APCM will be held on Wednesday 21st October at 8pm and, to enable access to that meeting, it will be held both in the building (ticket only) and on-line. Details of the necessary arrangements are to follow, but those who will not have on-line access will take priority when the bookings open. Nominations can be made electronically (4 PCC posts and 3 Deanery Synod posts are up for election). Forms are available from Amanda and will not need to be signed, but will need to have a proposer and seconder in the usual way. Elections will take place differently this year - details to follow.

Electoral Roll. We need to review our roll so if you would like to join this then please contact the Administrator for an application form by the 4th October.

Harvest & Foodbank. This year's Harvest Sunday will be on 11th October. Due to obvious reasons (their stock is currently very very high in addition to the COVID situation!) we will not be having our formal collection for the Food Bank. However, at their request, we will have an opportunity to have a second "harvest" thanksgiving in the New Year when we are able. A list is enclosed for those who still wish to donate directly and our Church collection box has been re-instated for this purpose (under the sanitising

station on entry). Inside this box there is a collection tin for financial donations which we would strongly suggest is the best way to offer help at the present time rather than food donations. Larger financial donations can be made and gift-aided via the Food Bank website. We have also been asked to publish the following:-

'Chelmsford Foodbank provides emergency food for people in our local community in crisis. This year, sadly, many may need to access the service that have not needed to before. In order to obtain food, you need a voucher which can be accessed from the Child and Family Wellbeing Service <https://www.essexfamilywellbeing.co.uk> 0300 247 0014 or Citizen's Advice <https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk/about-us/contact-us/contact-us/search-for-your-local-citizens-advice/local-citizens-advice-details/?serialnumber=100386> 01245 205579. You will then be able to collect food from the Foodbank centre or arrange for a delivery.'
